INTRODUCTION

Theopedia.com states that "the Sovereignty of God is the biblical teaching that all things are under God's rule and control, and that nothing happens without His direction or permission." Theological Charles Spurgeon said, "Cheer up, Christian! Things are not left to chance: no blind fate rules the world. God hath purposes, and those purposes are fulfilled. God hath plans, and those plans are wise, and never can be dislocated." However, many times God's sovereignty (and His goodness) are questioned because of the evil in the world.
